Raphaella Segal Assistant Mayor

Raphaella Segal (b. 1953), a founding member of Kedumim, is the Assistant Mayor of Kedumim. Raphaella was born in South Africa and came to Israel as a young child. Infused with the love of Israel and Zionism, she and her husband, Avi, joined the



pioneers who established Kedumim on Chanukah, 1975, and moved into a 24-square meter mobile home with the first group of families settling on the barren hilltop of Kedumim (literally, "ancient times").

The physical challenges of those early years were varied - electricity, water and heat could not be



taken for granted. School and education were given priority but supplies were virtually non-existent. Over the years, the families moved from the tiny mobile homes to small pre-fab housing and finally to private homes purchased by each family. Raphaella continued to serve the community in many different capacities, and shared the excitement and satisfaction of seeing the group grow over the years into a dynamic community. "I have seen how each of us contributed to changing the map of Israel and Jewish history; however, the fight is not over and there is still much to do", says Raphaella.

Daniella Weiss, the former mayor of Kedumim,

established the American Friends of Kedumim and asked Raphaella to meet the

challenge of widening its grassroots support. In a well-developed presentation, Raphaella emphasizes the historic roots of Kedumim and its strategic importance to Israel's security. She further illustrates how crucial it is to strengthen the communities of Judea, Samaria and Gaza as the pioneers try to outpace the rapid, often illegal building by the Palestinian Arabs. Ancient and modern converge as Raphaella demonstrates history



in the making and how "facts on the ground" can determine the future of the Jewish State.

Raphaella and her husband are the parents of nine children (seven of whom are married) and are blessed with grandchildren. Three of their married children live in Kedumim with other young families, many of whom are second generation residents of Kedumim.

Raphaella is an optometrist and vision specialist at the Schneider Hospital in Petach Tikva, and runs a private eye clinic in Tel Aviv.
